Raytown Middle School

Academic Focus

- DRT Summary: As we bring the year to a close, the data review teams demonstrated diligence in reviewing data for instruction. DRT leaders set the goals and agendas to share with their subject area teams. SMART goals and test data was discussed and pre-assessments were planned, effective strategies were reviewed and team leaders did an adequate job of modeling specifics ideas for their lessons. As a result of the focus placed on data, post results revealed growth in both math and ELA groups. STAR Summary for math and ELA: Math data demonstrates growth with each teacher at RMS. Teachers were proud to showcase their growth percentages averaging one half to over one years of growth. ELA results revealed similar results with the exception of a few classes. Overall, student growth is evident at RMS.
- Science Fair Under the direction of Jeff Haynes, physical science students participated in the first annual science fair. Eighth grade physical science students were challenged to demonstrate mastery of the scientific method by creating and presenting a science fair project. In the 3 weeks, students had to generate a hypothesis about a scientific phenomenon of their choosing related to chemistry, physics or biology. Students researched ideas, designed a series of controlled experiments, collected/analyzed data and wrote a conclusion that summarized their findings. This information was supported by the data and justified by current scientific laws, principles and theories. After their projects and presented them in our classroom. Judges for the fair included teachers, counselors, administration and secretarial staff, who were asked to participate in a gallery of science fair presentations. Some of the projects featured: The effects of caffeine on plant growth, soda on dental decay, listening to music on reading speed, is the "5-second rule" true. This was a truly meaningful activity for students as well as adults!
