Boys Swimming

- Raytown South finished 3rd at the Blue Conference Championships. Rome Richardson and Brody Helt won All Conference Honors. South had only 2 seniors this season. Their dual meet record this season was 6 and 2.
- Raytown High School boys team are the White Conference Champions. Winston Pieters, Nathan Searls, Carson Arnold, Charlie Farrand, Dominic Brandin, Alex Gippner, and Asher Hensel won All Conference honors. Raytown had no seniors this season. Their dual meet record was 11 and 1, cumulative record for the past 50 years is 576 wins, 91 losses, and 2 ties (.864%).
- The Bluejays qualified in seven events at the State Championship in St. Peters,

- The library held a Lunch and Learn discussing ELL instructional strategies with staff.
- Science Department
 - 6th Added an E for evidence to their KWL chart students were able to tell where the information could be found. High level and Middle of the road students were able to connect all the dots for the process of photosynthesis. Lower students - had a hard time with the chart and how to complete the chart. They taught each part of the chart each day.
 - o 7th Students are responding to routines which optimize academic time.
 - 8th As the deadline for the end of unit assessment approaches rapidly, we have covered several topics in preparation. The students are keeping up at a more impressive pace than we had anticipated.
- English Language Arts
 - 7th Grade noticed increased engagement in Amplify- particularly with A Raisin in the Sun.
 - 8th Grade students are engaged in academic discussions surrounding the themes in Night by Ellie Wiesel.
 - 6th grade says that students are actively engaged in vocabulary activities with the use of engaging vocabulary activities.
- Math Raytown Middle's Math department is making great improvements! This semester we've been working hard getting students to "think" math. Students are starting to discuss their math in small groups, which deepens their understanding and helps those that are struggling.
 - 6th graders have also been working really hard with Math Practice "Model with Mathematics". They have traditionally struggled with dividing fractions by fractions, but our teachers have been teaching them how to model situations and students are making all the necessary connections and moving faster with the concept.
 - 7th graders are solving area and perimeter with complex shapes, using their formulas and making real-world connections about perimeter and area.
 - o 8th graders are stepping up as well. They are currently learning an algebra topic of graphing linear relationships and making connections between several representations of those relationships. They are able to make intelligent, real life decisions when using linear relationships to compare situations like, which cell phone plan to use, which car is faster, and which plant grew faster in a science experiment.
