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PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Missouri Option Program permits full-time, public school enrolled students who are at least 17 years of age and who are at risk of dropping out or not graduating with their cohort group the opportunity to earn a standard high school diploma. Students enrolled in the Missouri Option Program are required to demonstrate and document the attainment of the major academic skills and knowledge associated with a high school program of study. *Missouri High School Equivalency Score Report* is one of the academic components required for the awarding of a high school diploma by the local Missouri public school district or charter school, and as such, is to be placed in the student's permanent record. Since the purpose of the Missouri Option Program is to qualify the student for a high school diploma, the scores are only valid in that context.

SECTION B - NARRATIVE

1) Provide a written description of the LEA's need and plan for utilizing the Missouri Option Program.

Raytown School District has a need and plans to utilize the Missouri Option Program to target at-risk students that are 17 years of age and at least one year behind their cohort Kindergarten group. Our program is to continue with the student's 4-6 year plan that was developed to work toward an identified goal, career or occupation. Our program will develop students' skills needed to pass the five content areas on high school equivalency Test (HISSET).

Raytown School District will use diverse student-centered instruction delivery methods with Rigor and Quality. The Missouri Option staff will use instructional delivery materials that will include a combination of direct instruction, textbook instruction, and computer based instruction.

Work force development activities/instruction will be integrated with other instruction to enhance the life skills/employability through Missouri Connections and Learning Express Library.

2) Describe the plan the LEA will utilize to ensure that staff and administrators will not encourage students to participate in the Missouri Option Program solely as a means of diverting students with discipline problems, poor academic performance, and similar circumstances as an alternative to regular school graduation.

The Raytown School District high school counselors provided 1-on-1 guidance for the students that are struggling with discipline and poor academic performance. Raytown School District has implemented School-Within-A-School (SWAS) that is housed at each high school. The focus is on getting students back on track that are experiencing attendance, discipline and academic performance issues. Also, the high schools can refer the student to the Alternative School that will provide additional support in the areas of academics, behavior and attendance.

To qualify for Missouri Option Program, students must maintain 90% attendance, have a plan to meet the vocational requirement, and be at an 8th grade level on the TABE test.

ASSURANCE STANDARDS – MISSOURI OPTION PROGRAM

The administrator(s) and teaching staff at all participating LEA sites are knowledgeable of and agree to comply with the Missouri Option Program Assurance Standards as identified below.

1.0 Program Eligibility Standards:

- 1.1 Students enrolled in the Missouri Option Program are exempted from the requirement to earn a specific number of credits for graduation purposes.
- 1.2 Each Missouri Option Program candidate is enrolled as a *full-time student* in the LEA in accordance with the criteria prescribed in Assurance Standards 4.2 and 4.3.
- 1.3 Student participation in the Missouri Option Program is voluntary.
- 1.4 Selection criteria for the Missouri Option Program are not ethnic, racial, or gender biased.
- 1.5 Students are 17 years of age or older.
- 1.6 Students are at least one year behind their cohort group in the credits needed to graduate, **OR** for *other significant reasons* identified in the local plan, are unable to complete their diploma with their cohort group (class). Cohort is defined as the year that a student enrolled in Kindergarten.
- 1.7 In accordance with the McKinney-Vento Act, students and a parent/guardian will sign a consent form for participation in the Missouri Option Program.
- 1.8 Students served by the Missouri Option Program are able to demonstrate the ability to read independently in English at a level sufficient to successfully complete instruction and testing.
- 1.9 Students with disabilities show evidence of a current Individual Education Plan (IEP) or Section 504 Plan, which indicates that participation in the Missouri Option Program is appropriate for the student. The IEP or Section 504 Plan documents any special education services and related aids and services necessary for successful completion of the program, including the testing component.
- 1.10 Missouri Option Program participants have access to all educational programs and services available in the LEA. 2.0 Program Instructor Standards:

- 2.1 Missouri Option Program instructor(s) have a valid Missouri teaching certificate, which may be an Adult Education and Literacy (AEL) certification.
- 2.2 New instructors participate in an orientation to the Missouri Option Program. Experienced instructors participate in Missouri Option workshops or other professional development (PD) activities offered through regional consortiums of Missouri Option operators and/or related association conferences or events. 3.0 Program Counseling Standards:

- 3.1 Counselor(s) have a valid Missouri Counseling Certificate.
- 3.2 Guidance and counseling services are provided to Missouri Option students consistent with the high school program.
- 3.3 Ongoing postsecondary and career advisement is provided by the Missouri Option Program instructor(s) and counselor(s), with supplemental guidance and counseling provided as needed.

4.0 Academic Instruction and Assessment Standards:

- 4.1 Instructional content is appropriate for tenth grade or higher and aligns with the *Missouri High School Equivalency Exam* sub-tests: Writing, Social Studies, Science, Language Arts Reading, Language Arts Writing, and Mathematics.
- 4.2 Missouri Option students are engaged in a **minimum** of fifteen (15) hours of academic instruction per week, which may include computer-assisted instruction.
- 4.3 Missouri Option students are also enrolled in other school-supervised instructional activities (Career Education courses, elective classes, volunteer experiences, work experience, etc.), that lead to the student's classification by the LEA as a **full-time student**.
- 4.4 As prescribed in Section 170.011, RSMo, to be eligible for graduation from high school in Missouri, students satisfactorily pass a course in Civics or Government and pass a test(s) on the provisions and principles of the United States and Missouri Constitutions.
- 4.5 Missouri Option students pass a half-unit course in Personal Finance and Health Education as per 5 CSR 20-100.190.
- 4.6 All Missouri Option students participate in appropriate state assessments, including all required End of Course (EOCs) assessments.
- 4.7 Students are enrolled in Missouri Connections and participate in postsecondary and occupational exploration activities, and complete a Career Portfolio <http://missouriconnections.org/materials/portal/home.html>

5.0 Graduation Standards:

- 5.1 All Missouri Option students take and pass the *Missouri High School Equivalency Exam* as a competency-based assessment for a *Missouri High School Equivalency Score Report* and complete all of the requirements set forth in these standards to be eligible for a high school diploma.
- 5.2 Student certificates will reflect a regular high school diploma as awarded to all students by local boards of education. Student transcripts will include a *Missouri High School Equivalency Score Report*.
- 5.3 Fifth through seventh-year seniors receive a high school diploma and are graduated upon passing the *Missouri High School Equivalency Exam* and fulfilling all Missouri Option and district program requirements.
- 5.4 Fourth-year seniors who are in the program for *other significant reasons* and successfully pass the *Missouri High School Equivalency Exam* before the end of the school year are engaged in a school-supervised course of study or employment/volunteer work equivalent to full-time student status (30 hours a week) until the end of the school year or when released according to LEA policy.
- 5.5 The Missouri Option Program does not circumvent compulsory attendance regulations or facilitate an early exit. - 5.6 Graduates of the Missouri Option Program are eligible to participate in a high school graduation ceremony with their peers.
