# Academic Focus

- RHS staff are currently preparing for our 6<sup>th</sup> year of critical thinking and argumentative writing. This year the staff will expand argumentative writing tasks to ALL classes at ALL grade levels. Additionally, the Data Review Team cycles have been revamped by the Building Leadership Team to allow teachers to more specifically target component skills of argumentative writing and thereby provide deeper direct content specific instruction. The initial writing task window will be during weeks 3- 6 of the first trister.
- RHS Band has seen a steady increase in participation over the last 5 years. Currently there are approximately 140 students participating in band, which is more than double the number of students participating 5 years ago. This is largely a result of the hard work of Joe Hill (band director) and Mike Doney (asst. director). The rigor and quality of this program is exceptional.

## Academic Focus

- The class of 2018 was the 55<sup>th</sup> class with 307 students. The largest class was in 1973 with 637 students. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest class in 27 years. In addition to scholarship money, 41 students have qualified for the A+ tuition incentive of approximately \$2800 each. This class has received over \$700,000 in scholarships for their first year of post-secondary education. The potential scholarships for 4 years totals \$2.7 million. This breaks the record set in 2010 for the most scholarship money earned in the history of the school since 1962. This total does not include the 3 South High students on the Herndon Culinary Team.
- Each year, the Joshua Center holds the "Me and My World Award for Excellence in Teaching". This is an opportunity for parents to recognize a teacher that has made an impact in their child's life. Colin Mulvilhill was unanimously chosen as the winner for 2018! Parent, Debra Mixon, wrote about the huge impact Mr. Mulvihill had on her son, Anthony.

# Academic Focus

• Poverty Simulation - RMS teachers participated in the Community Action Poverty Simulation (CAPS) which was a unique opportunity to teach the RMS team to understand what life is like for the 45 million Americans living at or below the poverty line. It's a team-building activity with a powerful message. Each teacher was assigned a persona: name, gender, age, physical health, and financial situation. For ex. You may be an elderly person suffering from chronic asthma or a high school student with a propensity for skipping school. The object was to remove staff

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members from their normal setting and create an alternative life

simulation. The simulation last one "month" (about 2.5 hours total), which is broken up into four 15-minute "weeks". The object of the activity was to finish the month with all bills paid and your family fed. It was an impressionable experience and teachers reflected on how they could make it a month in poverty as well as how this relates to our RMS families.

Harvesters Lunch Challenge: RMS teachers participated in the Harvester's Lunch Challenge which was a fast-paced, hands-on team-building program to help our team work toward a common goal and raise awareness about the issue of hunger. RMS Teams competed against each other to prepare healthy meals on a budget of \$12 and using food you would find at a food pantry. The activity encouraged creativity and problem solving, while promoting healthy eating. After the judging, our teams were able to eat their culinary creations. The experience was enlightening and fun for our RMS family.

## Parent/Community Focus

- Welcome Back Students: RMS began the year with grade level assemblies to welcome all students to RMS. Students were introduced to administrators, counselors, interventionist and support staff to ensure a smooth back to school transition. PBS guidelines and incentives were also reviewed and students earned RAPS tickets for demonstrating their knowledge of what it means to be Respectful, Accountable, Positive, and Safe. It is exciting to welcome all students back to the new school year.
