Academic Focus

The students recently competed in the Region 14 STAR Events regional-level competition, where they presented on a topic of their choosing related to Family and Consumer Sciences. Students were recognized for the proficiency and achievement of their project, which required multiple leadership skills. They each received a gold medal for their presentation and will compete in state, which takes place from Sunday, March 12 through Tuesday, March 14.
