- Functional Skills classes continues to offer their specialized coffee bar to staff. Last year the class opened up their first coffee bar titled, "Life's Skills Coffee Corner." The menu offers regular coffee, specialty coffees, and hot cocoa. Orders are filled and delivered on Friday mornings of each week. Students in the functional skills program work together under the direction of their teachers to fill the orders. As they continue to learn new skills, students are doing great making the coffee, as well as getting to know more of the staff members in our building. Everyone really enjoys seeing and meeting the students and appreciates the receiving their special beverage. The profit earned on the coffee bar is planned for a spring field trip; hoping to visit the College Basketball Experience!
- SPED teachers have been joining their regular education teachers in DRT. This has enabled the team to be part of planning and analyzing data for all students, not just SPED students. The SPED teacher's role has been to provide strategies as well as to become more of a voice in the classroom. Teachers are able to use the data from DRT to plan strategies for students as well as other students who might need the extra help. Case managers have reported that students have shown growth in the Achieve 3000 program. This data is being tracked and included in data presented to DRT. Several students have shown progress with the READ 180 program and have transitioned from resource to CWC settings. This data will be tracked to monitor continued success. It is the hope that with the continued communication and data sharing between SPED and regular education instruction, students with IEPs and those just needing a little push will continue to show growth as the year progresses.

  - Set a purpose for reading

  - Model how you read
  - Interact with student thinking

(from the second session at the faculty meeting), In ActivelyLearn:

- Take time to add extra help for the students who need it in the articles you choose
- There is no magic in ActivelyLearn, but the tools are there to make reading accessible to all students
- The goal is reading for depth which will then create deeper thinkers

- Twenty-five students in the three strands began internships in January. To be placed in an internship, students were required to apply, interview, and be selected for the internship.
