Co-Curricular Fine Arts Highlights

- 1. RQS excellent staff has helped the K-12 music program achieve the "Best Communities in Music Education" designation by the National Association of Music Merchants for two consecutive years.
- 2. Multiple Blue Star and Cappies nominations for RHS, including a Blue Star nomination for Outstanding Overall Production for the 2019 production of *Big River*.
- 3. Multiple students qualified for state and national speech & debate tournaments, including a State Champion from South High in 2022, and a National Champion from Raytown High in 2020.
- 4. Art students at RHS have hosted Jay-Fest each Spring, an art festival that showcases their work from the school year.
- 5. Secondary jazz bands have thriving programs. All district jazz band ensembles receive high ratings at their festivals and the season culminates with a "Night of Jazz" concert, featuring all secondary jazz ensembles.
- 6. Elementary all district choir continues to grow. This year we have 80 students involved.

Library Media Services Highlights

- 1. District media specialists take pride in servicing each and every Raytown student in regards to information and skills to process their world through information literacy.
- 2. Media specialists work with every student, giving them the power to navigate their unique world, by curating resources which reflect diverse perspectives and connections to the world.
- 3. When students empowered to learn and discover, using the proper skills, they develop ways to filter all of their learning through a positive and capable lens, enhancing their overall achievement.

Challenge (K-6th Gifted Education)

- 1. 4th and 5th grade Challenge students participated in the *Battle of the Brains* competition sponsored by Burns & McDonnell and Science City. Awarded 1st Place and \$50,000 out of 6,400 K-12 students from 240 schools in 50 school districts
- 2. Switched from the CogAT (Cognitive Ability Test to the NNAT (Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test) in 2021-2022 and identified 25% more students than with the original screener.
- 3. Created the <u>RQS Gifted Equity Plan</u> and implementing many of the recommendations listed in the following DESE document: <u>Identifying and Serving Traditionally Underrepresented Gifted Students</u>
- 4. Continue to review our screening and identification process to see ways of identifying more students from underserved populations including students of color and students living in poverty.
- 5. Review and assess the effectiveness of our middle school Challenge program to ensure we are maximizing and providing enriched learning opportunities for our middle school gifted students.

Advanced Studies Highlights

- 1. RQS provides advanced course offerings beginning in middle school.
 - a. 2 middle school courses can receive high school credit during the summer: World Geography and Communications.
 - b. 4 other courses students may take their eighth grade year for high school credit: Spanish 1, English 1, Algebra 1 and Physical Science.
- 2. RQS has several courses in which students may receive college credit while taking the course in high school.
 - a. 30 high school courses that can be taken for dual credit (RHS and RSHS)
 - b. 6 courses within the Southland Caps (Herndon Career Center)
 - c. 30 Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses through Herndon Career Center and Summit Technology Academy.
- 3. Students graduating with Industry Recognized Credentials, Dual Credit, or Articulated Credit from Herndon Career Center has more than doubled in the last three years.
