Goal #1-Collaborative Teams Performance:

(Include updates on CT goal % when applicable)

Raytown High School Collaborative Teams (CT's) will increase the percentage of teams meeting their instructional unit goals from 55.5% (10/18 groups) to 78% by May 2024.

- Our faculty is in the process of writing our Mission, Vision and Motto Statements. We opened our year by revisiting these items and then broke into four groups to discuss each of these goal areas. We will vote in the coming month and adopt our official Raytown Senior High School Mission, Vision and Motto! Our guiding coalition developed a process to track our collaborative team goals throughout the year and our teams are meeting each Wednesday afternoon! No teams have finished their goals as of 9/29.

Goal #2-Trauma Smart Implementation:

By May 2024, RHS staff will increase their use of Trauma Smart Strategies from 0% to 60% (measured in monthly surveys): Q1 - 100% of Staff will be trained in Modules 1 & 2, Q2 - Staff will identify Trauma Smart Strategies, Q3 - Staff will support students in using TS strategies & language, Q4 - Staff will support students from trauma backgrounds by using TS language

- Our Trauma Informed Care (TIC) Team had met twice with our consultant since the school year began. Our entire faculty completed Trauma Smart Module 1: Why Become Trauma Smart on August 18 and Module 2: Developing a Common Language on October 4. The TIC Team has developed a three question survey we will ask staff to complete once per quarter to gauge the effectiveness of implementation over the course of the year. As of 9/29 we didn't have results yet from the survey.

Goal #3-Student Attendance (90/90):

90/90 attendance at Raytown High School will grow from 58.72% to 70% by May 2024.

- We have shared our attendance goal and attendance procedures with families in our September Bluejay Bulletin. September 18 - 22 was our attendance awareness week. Prizes were awarded to students who had good attendance. Students with 92% attendance or higher will gain free admittance to athletic events beginning 9/25. As of the faculty meeting on 9/21 the percentage of students attending more than 90% of the time was 69.39%.

Raytown HS will reduce the Top 3 Discipline Infractions (office referrals) by May 2024 (20% reduction): Truancy from 816 to 653, Technology Misconduct from 536 to 429, Disrespectful & Disruptive Speech/Conduct from 591 to 473.

- We have strategically placed hall freezes on different dates and at different times to encourage on time attendance to class. Most teachers and administrators are present in the hallways during passing periods to prevent unwanted behaviors and encourage students to get to class on time. We have also created two Google Forms: a minor referral form that goes directly to our interventionists to support our staff with challenging behaviors and one to our assistant principals. We are in the process of creating a proactive room for student use - to strategize with an interventionist prior to an incident occurring. Total incidents in the above categories as of 9/29: Truancy - 75, Tech Misuse 37, Speech/Conduct 35.

Building Celebrations:

- Our World Schools Debate (composed of graduated seniors Billy Bettis, Shawn Hulen, Tochi Ihekona, Amaya Morgan, and Nya Vargas) team finished one win away from advancing at Nationals in June and one of our students, Shawn Hulen, advanced in Extemp Debate (his supplemental event).
- Boys Swim/Dive - Raytown High School is very young, no seniors because of covid, mostly freshmen and sophomores. Both teams have had an excellent pre-season of practices, but we are short staffed and may have to cancel our first meet.
- RHS Cheer Second Saturday Clinics: The Raytown High Cheer Program hosted our first Second Saturday Cheer clinic on Saturday, Sept 9th in the RHS Big Gym from 10-11:00am. This clinic was open to RQS 7th and 8th graders who learned more about sideline cheer/yell, and skills to join our program once they are high schoolers.
- The RWL team hosted a RWL Community Roundtable on Thursday, Sept 14, 6pm-7pm at the Raytown Schools Wellness Center. This event provided information to internal and external stakeholders of RHS and RSHS regarding the mission and vision of RWL as well as answered questions parents, students, school administrators, school board members, and community members had about Real World Learning. It was also an opportunity for companies to learn about the steps to take to become a business partner with RQS's RWL program in order to provide opportunities for students to earn market value assets which leads to college and career readiness. We are glad for all that attended!
- RHS Theatre just did auditions and started rehearsals for our fall musical, Sister Act. The show performs Nov 16-18 at 7pm! The Repertory Theatre class also has their first performance, a dinner theatre (serving soup and salad), on Thursday, 10/19 at 6:30pm. They are performing a hilarious murder mystery, Murder At the Banquet.
- The Boys' Varsity Soccer team defeated William Chrisman 5-4 after penalty kicks on Monday and earned a 2-0 win against Grandview on Wednesday. Franchesko Usuriaga Castro scored in both games and Marco Estrada made key saves in both games. The team walked away with another win 9/26 against Northeast HS. The team is now 7-1 and off to its best start since 2014. KMBC.com produced a story about the soccer team that ran in the news on 9/26.

Parents were pleased with the outcome of the dance and requested a tutorial video so their dancers could continue to practice. Everyone is excited to showcase their Jaywalker dance skills!
- Girl's golf is wrapping up their season next week with conference and districts. The girls have won their last three home matches against Raytown South, Truman, William Chrisman, Van Horn, Fort Osage, and Belton. We are looking forward to conference on Monday, October 2.
- The Raytown Bluejay boys swimming team is 8 - 0 in dual meets, and Raytown south is 2 - 2. Today, September 27, is the Eubank Invitational. Raytown is currently ranked in 9 events in the State Rankings. Top swimmers ranked are Nathan Searls, Winstin Pieters, Charlie Farrend, Dominic Brandin, Carson Arnold, and Asher Hensler. They will also compete in the Como invitational Friday and Saturday (September 29 & 30) and it is a bigger meet than the state championship.
- The Raytown girls tennis team is finishing up their 3rd season in the district. They just won their senior night match against KC East 8-1! They have districts in Jeff City this coming Saturday (9/30) and Monday (10/2).

This is a start to use our Trauma Lens with students.

70% of students will score 70% proficient on unit essential learning standards by the Raytown Middle School by May 2024.

- RMS will adjust goals at the end of each quarter, as needed. Our goal is for students to master the ESSENTIAL learning standard, not every standard.
- Departments will focus on ONE essential standard per unit.
- For accountability, each department should share out successes at faculty meetings so we can learn from each other and celebrate growth as a building. Share strategies that can be applied in any discipline. At least two grades per week, one of which should be an assessment.
- Meeting with Department Chairs Monthly to discuss CT Times and CFAs to discuss best practices used for formative assessments and how JET Time is going.
- Meet with Teacher-Leaders to discuss the JET Process and achievement data.

Goal #2-Trauma Smart Implementation:

RMS has adopted the Everyday Speech SEL program. This is a tiered program which will allow for not only teachers but our counselors and interventionists to engage students in Tier 2 and 3 lessons. In addition, students will be given pre and post assessments which will allow us to gauge where students are and to measure their progress. The goal for the building is to complete two units each quarter.

- 1st Quarter: The team just selected the program. We will train staff on October 4, 2023 and implement it on Wednesdays for the remainder of the school year.
- 2nd Quarter: Self-Awareness and Self-Management
- 3rd Quarter: Social Awareness and Relationship Skills
- 4th Quarter: Responsible Decision Making Skills
- Work with Dr. Cordell to map out a plan for effectively working with the Trauma Smart facilitators to support our new teachers in learning the components of the program.
- Met with my advisory coordinator to discuss the Digital Citizenship Lessons that were taught during advisory time.

Goal #3-Student Attendance (90/90):

RMS will increase our daily attendance by 50%.

Each month, the admin and counseling team will meet with Sarah Oliver to discuss our high fliers. Our social worker checks in with our families each month.

- 1st Quarter: The counselors offer an attendance incentive for each grade level and create a chart that depicts our daily attendance and display it in the front office area. In addition, students who maintain 100% attendance will have their name entered into a drawing for a cash prize by grade level. So far, we have an increase of our Tier 3 students attending classes because relationships matter at RMS.

- Weekly treats for classes that have perfect attendance five days in a row.

RMS will reduce our Top 3 Infractions by 20% by May 2024.

- Infraction A - Disruptive speech and conduct from 2006 incidents to 1600 incidents
- Infraction B - Disrespectful speech and conduct from 1175 incidents to 940 incidents
- Infraction C - Truancy from 643 incidents to 514 incidents
- Assistant Principals, Interventionist and Counselors meeting weekly to discuss student success plans.
- The Assistant Principals are meeting with teachers bi-weekly to discuss students concerns and work on solutions.
- Met with Interventionists to see how frequently students are coming to Recovery, the high-fliers, if the behavior plans are effective and what percentage of students are ready to be moved back to Tier 1.
- Teacher-Leaders will lead the staff through a book study on Discipline with Dignity.

Building Celebrations:

- Mr. Gidden was featured in the Cultural Competency Newsletter for his classroom display, I Am A Scientist. He states that "I thought my students might have a difficult time seeing themselves as scientists with only Albert Einstein and Issac Newton on my walls. I wanted my students to see themselves as scientists so I put modern people up that my students might relate to."
- Our students did well on the MAP Assessment in the areas of Science and Math.

- In 6th grade ELA/Reading classes, 80% of our students had mastery for two weeks in a row.
- In our 7th grade science classes, kids are really enjoying the labs and demonstrations. They are academically receptive to the interventions that are being implemented. Formative scores are improving.
- Ms. Giles, one of our 6th grade math teachers, has started Small groups for the 2nd week in a row. She has noticed that students who previously were not participating are now able to participate in small group discussions with confidence. They are asking questions and are more comfortable with wrong answers and redirects.
- RMS started a Step Team this year, lead by two new teachers to RMS, Mrs. Richard and Mrs. Hubbard.
- Congratulations to the Boys and Girls Cross Country for competing in the Buffalo Stampede Invitational yesterday. The Blue Jays were well-represented in the 1.5-mile race against 43 schools in the metro area. A big shout out to Joslin Orr for earning a medal place for finishing 13th out of 232 runners!

- TIC Team will train other staff members on the *Everyday Speech* curriculum on October 9th to begin implementation in classes on October 11th.

- We celebrated Attendance Awareness Week on September 25th-September 29th. Students had a visual Attendance Board to track attendance and heard daily announcements as they worked to earn an Open Gym Pass, candy/suckers, and a gift card.
- The Attendance Team will recognize September Perfect Attendance students with certificates and a treat.
- The Attendance Team will recognize September 95% Above Recognition certificates.
- Currently we have students at the following rate of attendance:
 - 100% Perfect Attendance - 42 Students [7.7%]
 - 95% or Above - 204 Students [37.71%]
 - 90%-94% - 129 Students [23.84%]
 - 85%-89% - 48 Students [8.87%]
 - Below 85% - 118 Students [21.81%]

Goal #4-Student Behavior (Top 3 infractions):

Raytown South Middle School will reduce our Top 3 infractions by 20% by May 2024. This includes reducing the following infractions and office referrals: Disruptive Speech/Conduct from 1242 to 994; Disrespectful Speech/Conduct from 656 to 525; Truancy from 334 to 267.

- Behavior RTI Team will use Small Group Intervention/Dialogue Circles to teach and build community, connection, respect, rapport and deeper discussion or reflection with students for what might be deemed as disruptive or disrespectful conduct. Ms. Linebach has had two groups thus far.
- The counselors will encourage and increase Student Mediations when appropriate. They are logging and documenting mediations conducted to determine later success and effectiveness.
- Continue conducting Hall Freezes and contacting families to inform of what is taking place at school.
- The Behavior Intervention Team will be discussing the increase in physical altercations to consider action steps and proactive ways to reduce this type of infraction in October.

- Content leaders attended the PLC Institute in July in preparation for leading their CTs
- The Guiding Coalition developed a first Agenda for every CT including the development of meeting norms and roles / responsibilities, and began discussion of how to write a WIG (wildly important goal) based on the essential standards of their unit
- Administrators are assigned to monitor and participate in each CT
- School teams participated in and contributed to the formation of our RTI system and what other students will be doing during Ravens Hour if they are not pulled for intervention; administrators monitor our staff's implementation

70% of teachers at Raytown Central will implement safe and predictable routines in all class periods to assure the greatest potential for student self-regulation, as indicated by walkthrough observation data, by May 2024.

- Teachers will “triage” with students at the start of class, using TS’s “brain as car” technique, or another strategy
- Teachers will post and reference the day’s learning target(s), criteria for success and agenda for each class period
- Teachers will consistently implement building behavior supports addressing “out-of-bounds” behaviors.
- Teachers will implement structured transitions with preventative procedures and routines.
- Administrators will monitor lesson plans for the above components.
- This is a regular item on monthly Guiding Coalition meeting agendas. Administrators and teachers will provide ongoing professional learning in how to embed these best practices throughout the year.
- Our staff averaged 5.5 (out of 7) on the ARTIC survey given by our TS trainer at the end of last school year. We will be sharing that data with staff at our Oct. 4 professional learning meeting.
