

## **SEAL OF BILITERACY PROPOSAL**

Students who are bilingual contribute to our communities and to the workforce in important ways. Currently, 33 states have adopted a Seal of Biliteracy Program to honor the language development developed by our most elite students. In the state of Missouri, the Seal of Biliteracy can provide students with up to 14 hours of college credit at several universities in the state. All students who demonstrate biliteracy, whether native English speakers or English Language Learners, may participate in this program.


Students earn the Seal of Biliteracy by demonstrating English proficiency on the English II EOC, ACT Reading, or ACCESS 2.0 for ELLs tests and by demonstrating proficiency in another language on one of three tests: AAPPL, STAMP4S, or AP Foreign Language & Culture.

Students must also demonstrate sociocultural competence. They may do this by presenting a portfolio of evidence, including recommendations, indicating successful use of both languages in the school, community, or workforce.

Once students have demonstrated the required English proficiency and sociocultural competence, it is recommended that the district pay \$20 per student to take either the AAPPL or STAMP4S test, as appropriate. The district should administer this test, which takes approximately 2 hours.

If students earn the required score on the AAPPL, STAMP4S, or AP Foreign Language & Culture tests, they will be awarded either the Seal of Biliteracy or Distinguished Seal of Biliteracy. This seal will be added to their transcripts.
