### **Eastwood Hills Elementary**

We are thankful for this community partnership. Additionally, the average number of daily office discipline referrals, indicating students who are using the focus room, is consistently declining, down from a high of 4.8/day in October to 2.2/day for the month of January.

- **NWEA Assessments:** All grade levels have completed NWEA assessments. We are using this data to compare individual student progress from Spring to now, to monitor the effectiveness of our Tier 1 instruction, and to evaluate students needing Tier 3 interventions. On this particular assessment, we saw greater building-wid growth in the area of reading than in mathematics.
- Math Interventions: Eastwood has focused our multi-tiered systems of support to students. We have modified our IMW schedule to include opportunity for both Tier 2 and Tier 3 instruction across grade levels, and developed a common assessment to evaluate student progress on high priority standards to inform focused and targeted Tier 3 instruction to close learning gaps.
- Learning Walk: Eastwood was honored to host 15 district administrators in the January learning walk! This time was highly valuable to Eastwood teachers through the feedback received from our guests.

#### **Parent/Community Focus:**

• Book Vending Machine reveal and Ray of Hope recognition: Thanks to the EWH PTA, we revealed our new book vending machine and will be spotlighted as a district Ray of Hope. Now students who advance along the reading continuum will receive a token to purchase a book from the vending machine. Students may also purchase a token with their Jr. Jay bucks! 


