
# **Blue Ridge Elementary**



### **Academic Focus:**

- Multi-Tiered Systems of Support: Eastwood Hills teachers have adjusted our procedures in the area of mathematics to ensure that every student is able to receive Tier 1 and Tier 2 instruction, and Tier 3 instruction as needed. We have focused and prioritized what is most essential for every student to learn in each grade level, and modified our intervention schedules to allow our classroom teachers, special education teachers, and title math teachers to collaborate to provide focused and intensive interventions to raise the math skill and achievement of our students. Every Monday students who advance along the intervention continuum are recognized over the morning announcements and receive a certificate and prize from administration and the math specialists.
- Community Learning Experiences: In the month of February, Eastwood students participated in three separate field trips. These experiences are highly valued, as they provide opportunity for the students at Eastwood Hills to engage in community learning that may not be available to them outside of the school setting. Our fifth grade students attended the A.B.May Academy to learn skills in customer service, personal finance, business values, and characteristics of the trade in plumbing and heating and cooling. Our third grade students went bowling and learned some practical application of mathematics and visible proof of force in nature. Lasly, our fifth grade students also toured the Negro Leagues and Jazz Museums!
