Academic Focus/Science

- The SEL focus PD session was a productive and engaging day. The objective was to will align trauma-sensitive classroom practices/strategies to behavior intervention strategies in order to maximize learning during instructional time. Signs of Suicide training (SOS) was also be a focus for the day. Teachers read Chapters 1-2 of Fostering Resilient Learners, Strategies for Creating a Trauma Sensitive Classroom. In addition, teachers participated in SOS training presented by the RMS counseling team. Other activities included, trauma sensitive classroom strategies, teacher confessions slideshow, calming activities, referral examples/rewrites, collaborative group discussions/stations. The meeting concluded with a three question exit ticket for reflection. 1. What is something new you learned related to suicide awareness? 2.List a Trauma-Sensitive activity/strategy you will apply or use in your classroom and 3. What other area of professional development would you like to receive training? Teacher response has been informative and meaningful.
- DRT department summary The process of identifying, collecting, and analyzing data indicating academic performance and growth is an ongoing effort at RMS. Review of the six steps to the DRT process and discussion takes place during data review each Wednesday. SMART goals are written to focus on areas to needed for improvement. Successes are highlighted and areas of concern are reviewed for refocus/re-teaching. Questions discussed include: 1. What actions will be taken once we review the data? Once we define action steps are, which ones are we going to use and what resources

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are we going to pull to support the academic deficiencies? The discussion and reflection is taken seriously and teachers share roles on how they will proceed as grade level teams. Sharing successes across departments as well as areas of concerns takes courage and teachers have been open to this practice this year.

Walking classroom - RMS reading specialist Jen Pearson introduced the Walking
Classroom to our teaching staff month. The walking classroom provides an innovative
way for students to get exercise without sacrificing instructional time. The program's
"Walk, Listen, and Learn" methodology capitalizes on the favorable link between
exercise and cognitive function. Teachers take students on a walk while everyone listens
to the same podcast through their Walking Classroom device and headphones.
Teachers and students are excited about "how" this concept will support literacy.
