Academic Focus

Academic Focus: Math

 Sixth grade math students completed unit two on dividing decimals prior to Thanksgiving break. We were excited to see students break down whole numbers into decimals to solve the division problems. Also students put forth a conscientious effort on rations. They were effective in identifying ratios which provided the opportunity for them to make their own! This engaging activity included students creating an image out of shapes, then created their own ratios from the image. Students did a commendable job staying neat and being creative.

- Seventh grade math students have been enjoying solving digital mystery pictures as a review for their next unit on proportional reasoning. These engaging assignments provide immediate feedback to allow students to progress at their own pace while revealing the mystery picture. Students like the accomplishment that comes from the result of revealing the answer through a picture. The assignment was differentiated by giving students different levels of scaffolded review notes. Students are assessed by accurately revealing the picture. Students really enjoy the pictures!
- Eighth grade mathematicians have been working hard learning about linear equations. Students have had a blended learning experience with hands-on activities, online learning and small group differentiation. Students are ready to show their level of understanding of slope, y-intercept and the relationship between variables within context. They will take this learning and extend it to unit four.
