Academic Focus

- <u>Kindergarten</u>: Students have been learning how they can take care of the Earth. Students went on a nature walk, discussed what is good and bad for the earth and learned the vocabulary words recycle, reuse, and rededuce.
- <u>First Grade</u>: First grade has been working on How-To Writing. Students work together to verbally share their thoughts and ideas, create an organizer, cut and sort in sequence introducing transition words, share their writing verbally to their peers, transfer their writing into an organizer, rough draft, edit, and lastly end with a final published copy. First grade students are now able to write six sentence paragraphs!

- <u>Third Grade</u>: 93% of third graders also met their SMART goal of being proficient on identifying and representing fractions on a number line!!
- <u>Fourth Grade:</u> 4th grade has worked on prewriting and drafting ideas for essays. Students are working hard to organizing their thoughts and ideas to respond to various types of writing prompts.
- <u>Fifth Grade:</u> Students wrote narrative pieces about their life story and they are so very cool!!
- <u>Multi-Age:</u> Students in Functional Skills went to visit their middle school; they are very excited about going to 6th grade next year! Students are working hard on their MAP test taking strategies ang giving their best effort!
