Academic Focus

- RHS Speech and Debate hosted the annual Last Blast Speech & Debate Tournament on Jan. 9 & 10. The tournament hosted over 25 schools from around the state and brought in hundreds of community members to serve as judges. This event is the single largest community connected event we host and our students and their coaches did a fantastic job. The tournament ran on time and provided a quality experience for all involved. A special thanks goes to coaches Taylor Ambrosi and Adam Higgins.
- ACT Conference: On December 7 Katie Cross, counselor, and LIndsey Pulvetreni, business teacher, attended the state ACT conference. They participated in several sessions focused on helping students become college and career ready as well as sessions on helping students manage the academic and social-emotional transition back to a more traditional educational setting post-pandemic. They will be hosting sessions at upcoming building Professional Learning to share the information with the RHS staff.
- RHS Counseling: The counselors have been busy preparing 9th-11th graders for 23-24 course selection/enrollment. The counselors spent several weeks visiting students in their Social Studies classrooms to present on course selection and to help students begin navigating the process. Students will continue to work on this through advisory and will finalize enrollment in Mid-February.
- RHS Faculty Fundraiser: Each year at our staff holiday party the 9 building departments assemble gift baskets that we raffle off with the proceeds going to the Heather Woodson Scholarship Fund through the Raytown Educational Foundation. This year's raffle raised over \$850. The Scholarship, established to honor RHS Teacher Heather Woodson, is awarded annually to an RHS student who shows academic excellence while also participating in extracurricular and co-curricular activities.

Academic Focus

- Raytown South student, Zaya Akins had her signing on January 2, 2023 and she will attend University of Kentucky on a full Track and Field Scholarship. Please give her well wishes when you see her.
- ELA Each English I class administered the formative assessment from Unit C on Edulastic. One question on this assessment addresses RI1D. All classes scored highest on this question (from 50% correct up to 80% for students who were given multiple attempts). This shows us while this skill needs more practice, students appear to be making progress. We will each continue to work on this standard.
- Math Geometry student just finished a quiz over basic trig, inverse, and pythagorean theorem. What the team noticed is students did much better with solving with ratios. The results inform the team that students struggle when giving too much information.
- Social Studies- World History-Current unit of instruction (Industrial Revolution) and the department discussed how the online Savvas website learning has great Project Imagine interactive activities to further support students learning and understanding of the social implications of child labor during the Industrial Revolution. The department also discussed incorporating modern issues that students can make connections with to today from the effects of industrialization on the environment.

Raytown Middle School

Academic Focus

- Sixth graders have been working on Punnett Squares by using math to find probabilities of genetic traits in offspring. They've done so by using pre-made genetic crosses and also coming up with their own. They also made posters showing the types of reproduction to help them visualize how life happens in many different ways.
- 8th grade worked on demonstrations on air pressure. Students were challenged to separate two balloons using only their breath. What they found out is that when they blew air between two balloons, the balloons came together instead of separating. This happens because moving air has lower air pressure than the air around the balloons and air always moves from high pressure to low pressure. Kids were also competing with each other. The teacher challenged two students to see who could blow up a balloon in a water bottle the fastest. Little did they know that the teacher poked a hole in one of the

water bottles so that one would always win. This was revealed at the end and students would tell the teacher that it's because air takes up space, the air was able to escape from the hole and the balloon will fill up.
