Academic Focus/ Speech and Debate

- Seventh grade Speech students finished their competitive drama unit by performing Poetry Interpretation programs. The class was divided into three sections to introduce students to theatre, competitive drama, and debate. The objective of the competitive drama unit is to demonstrate understanding of the rules and requirements of the competitive speaking events of Storytelling, Original Oratory, and Poetry Interpretation. The students learned the rules of Poetry Interpretation, watched three examples from national competitions, and then chose two poems with a common theme to weave together into a poetry program to perform for the class.
- Eight grade Debate students are learning about case construction and preparing to begin debating each other in class. Case construction is the act of researching and writing a debate case in order to participate in debates. This year's middle school topic is: "Resolved: The United States should replace means-tested welfare programs with a universal basic income" so students are currently researching welfare programs and universal basic income in preparation to debate each other about the topic.

- Track and Field Summary RMS coaches recruited 120 students for Track this year, providing a great opportunity to learn citizenship, accountability, work ethic, community pride and the sport. As of 4/26 the Boys record is 12-2 with two of those wins against Ray-Central and South. Currently the Boys 4x200 team of Micah Hall, Elijah Dunn, DJ Williams and Hyliss Davis has the fastest reported time in the state at 1:41. The girls are currently 10-4 with two of those wins against Ray Central and South. We are proud of our Blueiavs!
- School Play—Frozen, Jr. Under the direction of Kalyssa Brockman, Frozen JR. is based on the 2018 Broadway musical, and brings Elsa, Anna and the magical land of Arendelle to life onstage. The show features all the memorable songs from the animated film. - Our staff continues to share Instructional Success Stories to highlight the teaching and learning that takes place at CMS. Teachers and students continue to engage in high quality instructional activities that enhance learning and deepen student understanding of various concepts.
- The Cultural Competence Committee provided excellent professional development last month that centered around discovering our own cultures and belief systems and how that may impact our classrooms. The CCC worked with staff on table-top discussion to recap the work we've done and staff growth this school year. We established a revised working definition of cultural competency and developed a purposeful mission statement that describes our 'why' related to our focus.
- Ms. Irmiter led Social Skills classes in a lesson related to compromise, appropriate
 leisure interaction with peers, and taking turns. Students engaged in group discussion
 and Ms. Irmiter led students to play the board game, LIFE, to practice application of
 related social skills during the lesson. Ms. Irmiter demonstrated great teaching skills with
 checks for understanding and increased opportunities for students to respond to guided
 social skills questions for this activity.
