Academic Focus

- Boys & Girls State Update: RHS has 3 additional students selected to participate in Boys State: Anthony Carranza, Antonio Taylor, John Young will join our other 5 students (Joshua Ray, Arcianne Soria, Nigel Turner, Brett White, Page Worthington) at the end of June! We also have 4 female students participating in Girls State: Erin Seals, Hannah Batts, Yleiza Soria, and Deanna Barbee. Boys and Girls state will be held concurrently this year for the first time.
- RHS Student Council: have been awarded the Honor Council distinction by the Missouri Association of Student Councils. Only 57 councils in the state received this recognition.
- ouR Town: The RHS Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Committee is putting the
 finishing touches on our upcoming student forum event titled ouR-Town. This event will
 be a one day retreat for approximately 40 students and will be held on Thursday, April 6
 at the Wellness Center. Students and the sponsoring staff will engage in a variety of fun,
 thought provoking and engaging activities focused on working to make sure RHS is a
 more inviting, inclusive, and welcoming school for all students, staff, and visitors.

- RHS Girls Basketball placed 3rd at state tournament, this is the first team in boys or girls basketball history to place that high and the first girls team in school history in any sport to make it to the final four. The team won the District Championship for the first time since 2010 and is back-to-back Conference Champions. Head Coach Elyseia Dunn was awarded Conference Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year and named District Coach of the year. Summer Yancy (11) was selected All-State for the second consecutive year, District Player of the Year, all district team, and 1st team All-Conference. Lailah Hatcher (10) was awarded- All-District team and 1st team All-Conference. Amani Henry (12)was awarded 1st team All-Conference and Gladys Brown (12) is 2nd team All-Conference. Gladys Brown and Amani Henry will be on the Missouri All-Star team in the Missouri vs Kansas game in early April.
- RHS DECA had 2 students, Luke Taylor (12) and Shawn Hulen (12) place 5th in Sports and Entertainment Marketing Team Event at State DECA and are advancing to National DECA in Orlando, FL in April. This is a huge accomplishment!!
- RHS Choir: On Tuesday, February 28th, RHS Camerata performed with the University of Central Missouri choirs at their Spring concert. On Friday, March 3rd, RHS choir students participated in MSHSAA District Solo/Small Ensembles at Lee's Summit High School. Receiving an "Exemplary" and advancing to state on their vocal solos are Parker Cobden (12), Reiko Groves (10), and Nigel Turner (11). In total, 5 events received "Exemplary" ratings, 13 events received "Outstanding" ratings, and 6 events received "Satisfactory" ratings. On Sunday, March 5th, RHS Camerata participated in a masterclass with Nigel Short, conductor of the world renowned choir Tenebrae. The clinic took place on stage at The Folly Theatre. On Tuesday, March 21st,



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RHS Camerata and Concert Choir traveled to Lee's Summit West for MSHSAA State Large Ensemble Festival. Both ensembles received an "Outstanding" rating.
