Academic Focus

Argumentative Writing: RHS Teachers are collaboratively writing and implementing the 3rd round of our building-wide argumentative writing tasks. This is a part of our on-going efforts to improve students' writing and reasoning skills related to developing sound argumentation rooted in logical reasoning with use of textual evidence. Using the Data Review Team process teachers collaboratively scored and reflected upon the student work and well as their instructional practices. There are 5 tasks throughout the school year.

Academic Focus

- Building Professional Development Early Release Day 11/2/16
 - Session 1: SSR on "Creative Schools" by Ken Robinson followed by departmental discussions. Departments divided the reading and used the Text Rendering technique. Text Rendering utilizes each reader to compile a word, phrase, and sentence from his/her reading. Information is then shared and discussed as a group. Individuals shared reading results within PLCs. Many departments reported engaging and intriguing conversations as a result. Large group discussion will take place on January 11th to complete our faculty book study.
 - Session 2: MO Connections Each department had an individual present and guide through
 the steps to set-up MO Connections for advisory classes.
 Teachers explored MO Connections utilities and are prepared to implement through the
 advisory program. Any student not in the system was reported through a shared log so that
 all current students will be enrolled in MO Connections and ready to participate in the
 advisory curriculum. Counselors explored MO Connections and investigated how to pull
 reports from the system. They then brainstormed and discussed how to utilize the reports
 when working with students.
 - Session 3: PLC Times
 PLCs took time to share celebrations, review upcoming special schedules, and prepare for the next round of DRT and Content work.
 - Follow-up Needed:
 The book study follow-up will take place on January 11th as part of the scheduled book study activities. MO Connections work will continue through the advisory curriculum with grade-level coordinators disseminating plans and information as needed. Teachers can receive assistance via their grade-level coordinator or their PLC head. PLC- DRT and PLC follow-up is differentiated by department and determined within the individual PLC.
- Grandview HS teachers and administration visiting our school to learn about South PBS and ISS. Teachers will attend voluntary PD sessions to take place after school on a variety of topics determined by the BLT, LST, and/or TLT (PGP/Britelocker, STAR training, Literacy, PBS, Standards Based Grading, Differentiated Instruction, TLAC strategies, Block Schedule planning, Book Studies, Content Specific Topics, etc.)
- Teachers Jenny Ernst and Sarah Apple visited the Ron Clark Academy in Atlanta to observe innovative strategies that improve rigor, student engagement, and motivation.

Academic Focus

- November 2 Professional Development was a productive day. The Objective: This planning session provided teachers time for meaningful collaboration to prepare engaging lessons/units to support building instructional goals aligned to our CPL plan with One to One technology and 4.2 Indicator; Critical thinking skills. Teachers selected from a list of planning options to develop a deeper use/development of Actively Learn, use of text structures, collaborate to develop shared vocabulary, and a deeper use of tech tools/resources: Google docs, Google forms, Google classroom, Google drawing, Near Pod, Class dojo, Kahoots. Teachers provided support to help each other throughout the afternoon. High quality engaging lessons and units were created and taught.
- Math Highlights: The RMS math department has worked consistently to support their students by providing additional math tutoring for their students. A tutoring plan was developed and

implemented in October for math support to be provided five days a week for one hour before or after school. Student participation has been high and improved scores have been documented. The goal is to continue this plan throughout the school year, with a focus on small group, skill based instruction. I am proud of the effort demonstrated by our math team.

- Girls volleyball season: Students began the season with a steep learning curve as they were introduced to the game. The girl's exposure to more experienced players was difficult at the start, but many lessons were learned along the way. The second half of the season had more successes marked with a better understanding of the game. The girls became more consistent with serving, choosing the strategy of pass, set, hitting which led to several of wins. The highlight of the season for the A team was winning first place in the Grandview tournament and defeating our sister school, SMS. The B team learned basic fundamentals of volleyball and ended the season with a better understanding of the game. Students could pass, set and hook with ease. During the last week, the girls felt comfortable with blocking the net. The girls were very supportive of each other, displaying positive teamwork. The B team was excited that they won against CMS and SMS. The C team was also brand new to the sport. They learned the expectations of being a student athlete, the rules of volleyball, and the skills involved. The girls learned fast and improved dramatically from the first day of practice.
