#### Academic Focus

• Science Fair Under the direction of Heidi Adams, physical science students participated in the second annual RMS Science Fair. Eighth grade physical science students were challenged to demonstrate mastery of the scientific method by creating and presenting a science fair project. In three weeks, students were expected to generate a hypothesis about a scientific phenomenon of their choosing related to chemistry, physics, psychology or biology. Students researched ideas, designed a series of controlled experiments, collected/analyzed data and wrote a conclusion that summarized their findings. This information was supported by the data and justified by current scientific laws, principles and theories. After their experiments and investigations were performed, students then constructed displays for their projects and presented them in our classroom. Judges for the fair included teachers, counselors, administration by

providing feedback outlined on a prepared rubric. Some of the projects featured: An electromagnetic train experiment, ratio of sugar/baking soda on carbon snake growth, activator on slime, water bottle science, What triggers emotions, paper airplane designs and creepy facial designs. The high quality of the experiments was impressive and was a truly meaningful activity for students as well as adults!

- Track and Field Summary The 2019 RMS track season proved to be very successful which keeps with the longstanding tradition of winning seasons. This year RMS saw a record number of student athletes participate with 147 on the roster. Open track meets required three buses for the first time. Overall, the season record for boys was 29-8 and the girls team ended the season 27-10. Both teams were victorious against in district rivals RSMS and RCMS and RMS secured the birdhouse trophy 2018-2019 prior to the track season starting. According to the statistics compiled by Athletic.net, the Raytown Boys team was noted with top 10 ranked competitors. The 4X2 relay team was ranked first in the state with a time of 1:39. Long jump was third, 200-meter dash was fifth and the 4X4 relay team ended the season ranked seventh in the state of Missouri. We are proud of our Blujays!
- Music Department The month of May presents an exceptional display of music excellence. Each class is represented during spring concert season performing a medley of the year's classic songs. Vocal and Instrumental departments represented RMS with talent pride and dignity, led by Brian Marson, Amy Sadler, Mike Doney and Tyler Rick. It is an honor observing our students perform such high quality music.
