Academic Focus

• Data Team Review and Writing Focus: During the month of December, teachers and students focused writing instruction on expository writing. The primary focus of the writing is staying on topic and presenting information in a logical order. Incorporated into the organization is details from sources such as books, articles and Internet. In the primary grades, student writing samples show evidence of students transitioning from pictures to writing in complete sentences that are focused and connected. The intermediate grades demonstrate evidence of logical flow and connectedness with big ideas and supporting details. Observational data of teachers shows the focus on writing shows a deeper connection to reading and the ability for students to communicate effectively.

- Santa Shop: Each year, the Blue Ridge PTA opens a Santa Shop for students to buy presents for parents, siblings, teachers and friends. Every item in Santa Shop cost \$1. Students enjoy the opportunity to buy presents for friends and family.

Academic Focus

• This month at Eastwood Hills, MAP and STAR data were reviewed. Collaboratively, as a building team, teachers reflected on summative and benchmark evaluation data to examine our current practice and consider changes needed in instruction and interventions to more systematically target student needs. Teachers identified professional learning they need to provide the best instruction to students and professional development in the areas of targeted reading and math intervention was provided. Specifically, the Title Reading teacher and Principal met with 4th & 5th Grade teachers to review the reading progression and guided teachers through identifying reading intervention needed based on skill deficits within the reading progression. Specific instructional strategies were provided to address deficits in phonics, fluency and vocabulary. Additionally, as a building team EWH teachers watched the video of Greg Tang teaching Blue Ridge 2nd graders to evaluate mathematics instructional strategies observed within the lesson to be incorporated into whole group and Interactive Math Workshop at EWH.

Parent/Community Focus

 On December 18th Eastwood Hills, in conjunction with the PTA, hosted our second Family Fun Night of the year. From 6:00-8:00 PM students and families joined with Eastwood Hills staff for a viewing of The Polar Express in the school gymnasium. Students brought blankets and pillows and wore their PJ's.
