# Elementary Schools <br> Monthly Board of Education Report 

## Blue Ridge Elementary

## Academic Focus

- Blue Ridge kicked off a writing focus this year starting with personal narratives. Students kindergarten through fifth grade are taking a deep dive into the components of narrative writing. Between our first two data review teams, students improved their ability to connect their writing to the essential features of narrative writing. Kindergartener demonstrated the greatest amount of growth. Only 30\% of students connected an illustration to their writing on a cold prompt. After direct instruction and feedback, $93 \%$ of the kindergarteners matched their illustration to a narrative statement. One kindergartener drew a picture of a bumble bee in a field of flowers and wrote, "I see a bumble bee getting nectar from the flower to make honey".
- Drop Everything and Write (DEW) is a ten minute block of time at the end of the day when most Blue Ridge students and teachers are engaged in free writing. Teachers decided to build stamina and confidence in writing by providing students with an uninterrupted opportunity to write thoughts, feelings and stories. Interestingly, there are a growing number of students who treasure this time of day. Teachers report students are excited to share writing with the teacher and peers. In future months, students will have an opportunity to showcase their writing produced during DEW.


## Parent/Community Focus

- On Tuesday, September 25, Blue Ridge hosted Math Night for families. Parents and students engaged in Greg Tang math card games, life size board games, and math computers games. Walking tacos were served for dinner.

## Academic Focus

- Data Review Teams: Teachers continued to focus on the data team process. Grades set SMART goals to for priority standards and begun specific instructional planning to meet the various needs and skills based on formative assessments.
- Social Emotional Learning: Kindergarten and First grade SEL Small groups will be held with 30 students in which Whole Body Listening, Emotions, Self Regulation \& Social Awareness will be taught. The goal of these groups is to increase positive student behaviors to decrease time spent out of class.
- Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire: Spring Valley is one of several schools Piloting the Strengths and difficulties Questionnaire (SDQ) this year. The SDQ is a brief behavioural screening questionnaire for 3-17 year olds. The SDQ ask about 25 attributes, some positive and others negative. These 25 items are divided between 5 scales: emotional symptoms ( 5 items), conduct problems ( 5 items), hyperactivity/inattention ( 5 items), peer relationship problems (5 items), prosocial behaviour ( 5 items). Recently teachers completed a survey. Every student in the building was assessed using the SDQ.

- Back to School Night Picnic: Spring Valley hosted a back to school night on Thursday, September 6th. Families came out to enjoy a cookout and paint rocks out on the playground. More than 100 people showed up to participate in the festivities.

The purpose of this PTA event was to build a stronger community feeling with our families and provide a fun Friday night activity. Families snuggled up with blankets, pillows, and popcorn as we watched Ratatouille in the gym.
