Goal #1-Collaborative Teams Performance:

Raytown High School Collaborative Teams (CT's) will increase the percentage of teams meeting their instructional unit goals from 55.5% (10/18 groups) to 78% by May 2024.

• In March we held our Guiding Coalition meetings on 3/6 and 3/20 where we discussed the following: presentation from Equity Council, Principal Meeting Data Share, began planning Jaybird Enrichment Time for the 24-25 School Year and ways to improve the culture of RHS. We hosted a faculty meeting on 3/21 where we updated the faculty on the progress of our goals in our School Progress Plan and celebrated Collaborative Teams on the work they have accomplished this semester. 75.73% of Collaborative Teams at RHS have met their Wildly Important Goals this school year.

Goal #2-Trauma Smart Implementation:

By May 2024, Raytown High School staff will increase their use of Trauma Smart

Strategies from 0% to 60% (measured in monthly surveys): Q1 - 100% of Staff will be
trained in Modules 1 & 2, Q2 - Staff will identify Trauma Smart Strategies, Q3 - Staff will support
students in using TS strategies & language, Q4 - Staff will support students from trauma
backgrounds by using TS language

 We completed a Trauma Smart Training on March 11, Module 5: Routines and Rituals/Consistent Response Training. Our Trauma Informed Care Team met on 3/20 to review survey results from Module 4 and a survey taken at the Module 5 training. We will host a lunch on 3/21 during Family/Teacher Conferences to build community and belongingness amongst the RHS staff.

Goal #3-Student Attendance (90/90):

90/90 attendance at Raytown High School will grow from 58.72% to 70% by May 2024.

• The administrative team recognized students March 1 during lunch shifts who had 92% attendance or above. Students got to spin the wheel and win one of many prizes: soda, water, chips, candy, socks, etc. We also hung posters in the cafeteria to have a class competition to show which class will have the highest percentage of students over 90% attendance before the end of the year. The senior class is currently winning with their percentage at the end of February 63.2%. Our current attendance percent of students above 90% is 60.67%.



Goal #4-Student Behavior (Top 3 infractions):

Raytown High School will reduce the Top 3 Discipline Infractions (office referrals) by May 2024 (20% reduction): Truancy from 816 to 653, Technology Misconduct from 536 to 429, Disrespectful & Disruptive Speech/Conduct from 591 to 473.

- Total incidents in the above categories as of 3/20: Truancy 551, Tech Misuse 154, Speech/Conduct 311.
- The administrative team along with teachers, interventionists, counselors, etc. have implemented a new procedure for students that are late to class. We are meeting with parents and students to ensure on time attendance at the beginning of the day and for each class period. We can make academic gains when we can maximize the number of minutes each student is in class!
- Students with 0 behavior referrals were recognized by the Raytown Educational Foundation on March 18 with a cupcake. We were able to recognize 998 students!

South High School's Collaborative Teams will meet 75% of their WIG Goals each quarter through the end of the year.

 Our Goal is to challenge teachers to place mid and High level DOK assignments into their commitments. Our commitments are becoming stronger. Our GC would like to see Student work with the commitments

Goal #2-Trauma Smart Implementation:

By May 2024, 95% of South High School's staff will be trained to be Trauma Smart

- TIC team meeting with consultant to refocus and begin goals for next year with new Principal
- Reflect on the specific ways we did demonstrate TS
- We have decided to reduce the size of our TIC team for effectiveness. We believe that some members of the TIC team are not the right FIT for our goal. We hope this way we may convey the same message to our teachers.
- Meeting on 4-02 regarding the results of our Rituals and Routines to improve our school.

Goal #3-Student Attendance (90/90):

By May 2024, 65% of South High School's students to meet the 90/90 attendance goal

- 13 students moved into 90% or above
- 55 students moved or stayed in the 85% or above but below 90%
- The remainder of the students dropped in attendance
- Our goal is to work with my Social worker and other staff to move the 55 students to 90% and over. I am hoping by narrowing our focus will produce better results
- In our goal to move students, we have met with students in the 85%-89% to encourage their attendance
- We have offered gift cards drawing for kids who continuously stay in the 90% range.
- My goal is to target students by name and place them in my next commitment so we may be intentional with their success to reach 90%

Goal #4-Student Behavior (Top 3 infractions):

By May 2024, South High School will decrease our top 3 infraction by 20%

- Excessive Tardies from 1304 to 1044
- Truancies 379 to 304
- Disruptive Speech and Conduct
- We have a group of students (25-30) that have excessive tardies, truancy, and overall apathy to school. Working with our Interventionist, we placed these students on a no pass list and they should only be excused from class by escorts.
- Goal is to get them in class and keep them in class
- Plan to get them in class we have to force them into class check bathrooms, be in



- halls, know their schedules...every hour, every period, every day...
- 3 Tardies in 1 Day = ISS the next day. Truancy over 5 minutes...ISS right now for rest of day
- Escort Plan once in class teacher must call for escorts...all day, all hour, anywhere they need to go...2 Escorts per day..
- We are celebrating 743 Students who do not have a tardy or referral through REF. This is a great reminder to our staff.
- Our TIC team and GLST are working together to discuss how some of our students are affected by school and how we may offer tools for them to function during the day

- I would like to celebrate our Support Staff employee of the year Mr. Beard. He is an interventionist in our building and does a great job working with students and staff.
- I also want to celebrate Mrs. Whitney Wells as the Certified Staff employee of the year at South High. Mrs. Wells is always available for our students and staff in the library and prides herself on building relationships with everyone
- Congratulations to Mr. <u>Monte Yancey</u> for being named the National High School Strength and Conditioning State Coach of the Year. Mr. Yancey is an integral part of our Strength and Conditioning classes during the school day and after school conditioning with our athletes.

Central Middle School will increase the percentage of teams meeting their instructional goals from 9% to 60% by May 2024.

GOAL - Update/Adjustments:

1st Quarter: 4 WIGs set; 4 met for 100% 2nd Quarter: 20 WIGs set; 16 met for 80% 3rd Quarter: 22 WIGS set; 18 met for 82%

- During February and March, administration held several meetings with individuals and CTs to clarify requirements of CT processes and their recording of results.
- Admin. also met with members of the district Instructional Team to discuss the use of curricular resources and the results from our teachers' Tier 1 instruction (for the highstakes content of Math, ELA, and Science).
- Admin. met with our building ELA and Math interventionists about their processes with RTI; we discussed how to reflect Tier 2 results in students' grades.
- All of these topics were a part of our March Guiding Coalition meeting.



 Admin. met with CORE teachers and led professional development: reflections on teachers' use of Guided Note-taking.

Goal #2-Trauma Smart Implementation:

(Include updates on TIC Team commitments and student/staff data when applicable) 80% of all Central Middle School staff will implement safe an predictable routines in their classes to assure the greatest potential for self-regulation, as demonstrated by the following criteria:

- Every teacher will triage (take the emotional temperature) of all students at the start of class using one of many strategies shared in TS training or building professional learning.
- Every teacher will post and refer students to the day's learning target(s), the criteria for success on the learning target, and the agenda of class activities for the day.
- Every teacher will consistently implement building supports that address out-of-bounds behavior.
- Every teacher will provide clearly structured transitions with preventative procedures and routines.

GOAL - Update/Adjustments:

1st Quarter: 75 total observations - ave. score = 6.41 out of 8 (80%)

2nd Quarter: 7.6 out of 8 (95%) **3rd Quarter:** 7.5% out of 8 (94%)

- Admin. took data on and discussed these expectations with teachers during their evaluation conversations between January and March, along with other components of our classroom observations.
- Principal will meet with Ms. Neiderer (Dir. of TS) this month.

Goal #3-Student Attendance (90/90):

90/90 attendance at Central Middle School will increase from 67.79% (22-23) to 70% by May 2024 GOAL - Update/Adjustments:

1st Quarter: 75% of students met the 90/90 attendance expectation **2nd Quarter:** 68.65% of students met the 90/90 attendance expectation. Cumulative: As of the end of Dec. 71.69% of students are meeting the

90/90 attendance expectation for the year, which is an increase of 4% from last year at this time.

3rd Quarter: 70.05% of students met the 90/90 attendance expectation as of March 31, 2024, which is an increase of 3% from last year at this time.

Administrators and our Attendance team have been implementing many incentive ideas
to get our chronically absent students to increase their attendance. We also send letters
home consistently and try to be as welcoming as we can be to students upon arrival and
during the day.

We will continue to promote consistency with our building behavior system among all staff and students.

- We believe our decreases in behavior incidents is extraordinary and worthy of celebration.

Goal #2-Trauma Smart Implementation:

Raytown Middle School has adopted the Everyday Speech SEL program. This is a tiered

program which will allow for not only teachers but our counselors and interventionists to engage students in Tier 2 and 3 lessons. In addition, students will be given a pre and post assessment which will allow us to gauge where students are and to measure their progress. The goal for the building is to complete two units each quarter.

- Students are working through Unit Four on Relationship Skills of the Everyday Speech Program. The following lessons are being taught: Grade 6 - "Influences on You"; Grade 7 - "Forgiveness"; Grade 8 - "Resisting Social Pressure."
- Staff completed the ARTIC Survey with our Trauma Smart Facilitator during our March Staff Meeting.
- STUCO rewarded students who continue to demonstrate RAPS (Respect, Accountability, Positivity and Safety) with rewards.
- The Trauma Smart focus for March was Identify and Trauma Integration with staff and students.
- Our Trauma Smart Facilitator was in the building on March 12th to visit classrooms.

South Middle School Collaborative Teams will increase their percentage of core content teams meeting their instructional unit goals from (0/12) 0% to (9/12) 67% by May 2024. Progress Update: There were 42% (5/12) of core content Collaborative Teams that met their Wildly Important Goal for the current unit in the 3rd Quarter.

- CT Teams meeting their WIGs during the first semester included Math 6, Science 7, ELA 8, ELA 6, Amer History 8.
- For Cardinal Academic Hour, teachers received professional learning on the impact of structure and consistency with having students read and write on a daily basis. CAH time has been re-worked to include SSR and MAP Accelerator minutes each day.

Goal #2-Trauma Smart Implementation:

South Middle School staff will pilot and implement SEL Curriculum, *Everyday Speech*, to strengthen Tier 1 social and emotional skills and learning for our students, with 100% of students getting related lesson exposure at least once each week. South Middle staff will establish routines in classrooms that feel safe and predictable by posting a visual of the learning objective and agenda for the day.

- The TIC team met on March 18th and set goals to help staff with techniques for self-care and common language with students.
- A Trauma Smart booster on Attunement was provided by the counselor and social worker team in March for staff to refresh on this aspect of the trauma-informed care journey at South Middle.

Goal #3-Student Attendance (90/90):

South Middle School 90/90 Attendance will grow from 62.7% to 80% of students in attendance regularly by May 2024.

Progress Update: Our current attendance percentage of students at 90% or above for attendance is 59.9%.

- Perfect Attendance 2 [.40%]
- Above 95% 151 [30.14%]
- Above 90% 135 [26.95%]
- For recognition of attendance goals of 90/90, there were 243 out of 288 eligible students taken on a field trip to Rink Ratz Skating Rink and provided certificates.



Goal #4-Student Behavior (Top 3 infractions):

South Middle School will reduce our Top 3 infractions by 20% by May 2024. This includes reducing the following infractions and office referrals for major incidents:

- Disruptive Speech/Conduct from 1242 to 994;
- Disrespectful Speech/Conduct from 656 to 525;
- Truancy from 334 to 267.

Progress Update:

- Discipline infractions for Quarter 3, included 343 events, compared to last school year Quarter 3 with 799 events logged. This is a major improvement from last year's discipline at the same time.
- Students earned miniature Snickers bar candy and open gym passes for being safe, respectful and responsible by being in class on time or being recognized by their teacher.
- Admin team made contacts home for Tier 2 Behavior Success Plans and partnerships with parents over the PT Conferences, as well as throughout Quarter 3.

- Majority of RSA students coming to RSA with very low attendance.

Raytown Success Academy's students will reduce behavior infractions 10% over the previous 3 quarters. Those who have no interactions (ODR) will be recommended for return to their home school.

- Decrease in fighting 18 first semester, 0 second semester

Building Celebrations:

- 5 students began part time transitioning to home school 4th quarter. This means the last two hours of the day and lunch and two hours on Wednesday. Allows students to acclimate back to home school while still getting supports from RSA.
- 5 Students began full time at home school beginning 4th quarter
