Small group time ends with fun paired reading passages to practice reading aloud and to answer comprehension questions. In math, each group starts with a brain-teaser for about 5 minutes, then move to a daily word problem and work on practice skills needed to be successful with our current math curriculum topic. The current topic is learning/practicing strategies to reduce/simplify fractions.
- The Functional Skills class opened up their first coffee bar this month titled, "Life's Skills Coffee Corner." The menu offers regular coffee, specialty coffees, and hot cocoa. An order form has been created for teachers/staff to make their selection. Their order is filled and delivered on Tuesday mornings of each week. Students in the functional skills program work together under the direction of their teachers to fill the orders. They are learning new skills, which include setting up the shop, writing tickets, making coffee, taking money, making change, serving coffee, and

- practicing good customer service skills. Students are so excited and proud when they deliver the coffee they prepared.
- Recent STAR Math reports reveal that students in resource math classes have demonstrated growth from the beginning of the school year to the mid-year point. Teachers are practicing math fluency facts while incorporating a Valentine's Day activity in the upcoming weeks.
