Academic Focus

 The Practical Arts department spans across many areas of education including Business, Family and Consumer Science, Physical Education, Wellness, and Project Lead the Way.



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- Through courses such as Marketing, College and Career Prep, Personal Finance, Business Fundamentals, Accounting, Travel and Tourism, and many more, students get a taste of many aspects of the business world. Many students are active participants in student-led organizations such as DECA and FBLA. Additionally, our Real World Learning representative, Mr. Frazier and other guest speakers bring in very relevant insight.
- The Physical Education and Wellness department objectives are to increase performance through research-based, well-planned programming with the assistance of technology to enhance their experience. In wellness class students learn about health related skills and how/when to use them effectively to increase or maintain personal health. These skills range from hands-on activities of first aid and CPR to simply knowing where to find information and resources.
- In Family and Consumer Science, our Fashion students are excited to start making their Pajama Pants. It is their first time working with a PDF pattern. PDF patterns allow students to print patterns at home, so they make pattern sewing more accessible and less expensive. Our Foods students are working in various units including learning various ways to cook with eggs, learning about Grains and Legumes, and studying Mexico and South America! Many students are active members of FCCLA.
- In PLTW courses, students use the activity, project, problem (APB) model to learn science and engineering principles. Students solve real-world problems and projects that help students develop the skills and knowledge that can be applied in their future careers. Right now in Introduction to Engineering and Design, students are using CAD to design a case with a hinge that stores and protects a pair of wireless earbuds. Students then prototype their designs using 3D printing. In Principles of Engineering, students are designing and building hydrogen fuel cell powered fan boats to learn about alternative energy and mechanical system efficiency. In Digital Electronics, students are designing a fireplace pilot light detector circuit that prevents gas from flowing into an unlit fireplace and also has a service indicator light to alert system malfunctions.
