- MAP GLA Practice Assessments: The third through fifth grade students participated in the
  practice MAP GLA assessments during this month of January. These practice assessments
  provided teachers and students with information about test format and question types. It also
  gave students and opportunity to experience working with the online tools. The teachers are
  meeting with ELA and Math Curriculum Coordinators to discuss observations of the practice
  GLA.
- **STAR Data:** Data teams reviewed STAR data from December. Teams examined Growth Reports to compare scores from September to December. Teachers also placed students in quardrants based on percentile scores. They identified trends in how students are progressing throughout the year.
- Professional Book Studies cont.: The three book studies continued meet. We are ready to being a second round for "A Teacher's Guide to Classroom Management" during the month of February. Several teachers expressed interest in reading this book. Currently, 18 teachers are participating in one of the three book studies. The book titles are "A Teacher's Guide to Classroom Management," "The End of Molasses Classes," and School Culture Rewired." We anticipate this number to increase as the semester continues. The book studies are receiving positive feedback.

### **Academic Focus**

- **Testing:** Growth was seen with STAR testing, and classes are celebrating those accomplishments. Teachers are cross-referencing those scores with the day-to-day data taken through unit testing, quick quizzes and exit tickets. With grades 3-5 completing the MAP Practice Test, teachers have a renewed sense of what students have a clear understanding of and what areas must be a focus in upcoming weeks. They are looking at data and analyzing how that will adjust instruction. With Spring Grade Level Assessments also just around the corner, teachers are emphasizing goal setting with students and tightening up on test-taking strategies. District Coordinators have provided lots of great information and learning opportunities to our teachers over the last few months dealing with spring testing.
- Committee Updates: Our various building committees are working hard on projects that will help push Robinson to further success. Our Curriculum and Data Team has facilitated the development of the data board and the monthly updates to it, as well as providing clear and concise information about what "look fors" are in each area of learning. The Positive Behavior Support Teams are updating the second semester behavior grade level goals and working on tightening up the matrix expectations to help decrease behaviors where our data shows areas of concern. Our building just celebrated "flurries and fun" with students showing that safe, respectful and responsible behavior. The Cultural Competence Team is presenting a book study to all staff on Engaging Students with Poverty in Mind by Jensen which is a second book to the series started last year with staff.

- Teacher Peer Observations: As SV continues to review instructional data and determine
  critical areas of support needed for students, small group instruction has been the
  determined area of focus. Teachers will review video recordings of their peers, provide
  feedback of small group instruction, and outline instructional plans. This feedback will
  allow grade levels to determine instructional strategies that are essential to student
  growth and development through collaboration and instructional practices.
- **DRT Meetings:** A deeper dive has begun to take place for SV's data review team meetings through the questioning model that is displayed with students and teachers in the classroom. DRT meetings will focus on 3 questions to be answered by grade level teams, so that a laser focus is maintained on the instructional processes and supports based upon data. The three questions of focus will be: What is your strategy based upon the data? What risk will you now take? What are the outcomes based upon the risk taken? Teachers are excited about the deeper dive of questioning in support of the DRT process.

- Data Meetings: During the month of January, grade levels refocused conversations around the Four Essential Questions of Professional Learning Communities: What do we expect students to learn? How will we know if they are learning? How will we respond when they don't learn? How will we respond if they already know it? Using these questions, the teachers narrowed their focus to ensure 80% of students master one standard in reading and math per unit. In order to say that the students mastered the standard, they will need to demonstrate the skill in a variety of setting and show transfer of knowledge.
- Problem Solving: Students in all grade levels are focusing on the 6-step problem solving model
  presented by Greg Tang. Eighty percent of students have mastered two additions strategies. By
  the end of the month, students will master four strategies for addition and subtraction. Blue
  Ridge attends Greg Tang professional learning on February 28.
